Falls, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (AK Team 1). IMT is also managing the Telephone, Sand, Poison Creek and Whiskey Mountain fires. Twenty-six miles northwest of Burns, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Telephone, Malheur NF, USFS. Sixteen miles northeast of Burns, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sand, Malheur NF, USFS. Five miles southeast of Izee, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Poison Creek, Malheur NF, USFS. Ten miles southeast of Seneca, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Whiskey Mountain, Malheur NF, USFS. Ten miles south of Izee, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Crazy Creek, Ochoco NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 5). Sixteen miles northeast of Paulina, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous residences and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Pioneer, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (CA Team 15). IMT is also managing the Easy fire. Started on private land 10 miles southeast of Stehekin, WA. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and uphill runs. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Easy, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seventeen miles west of Mazama, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and uphill runs. Structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Diamond Complex (8 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 7) to CIMT (NR Team 3) will occur tomorrow. CIMT is also managing the Middle Fork fire. Eighteen miles southwest of Chemult, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Middle Fork, Crater Lake NP, NPS. Fourteen miles northeast of Union Creek, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and spotting. Trail closures in effect.

Retreat, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 1). Started on private land 14 miles southeast of Naches, WA. Grass and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, group torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lane 1, East Lane Unit, ODF. CIMT (NC State Team 1). IMT is also managing the Adam Mountain fire. Fifteen miles southeast of Springfield, OR. Timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and backing. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Adam Mountain, Umpqua NF, USFS. Six miles southeast of Dorena, OR. Timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with group torching, uphill runs and backing. Numerous structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Willamette Complex (4 fires)**, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1) Includes the previously reported Chalk, Moss Mountain, Coffeepot, Ore, Pyramid and 208 fires. Four miles northeast of Oakridge, OR. Brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Homestead Complex (5 Fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Thirty miles northeast of Glide, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, flanking and isolated torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Swawilla I, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT (SA Team 2) mobilizing. IMT is also managing the Bridge Creek fire. Ten miles southwest of Keller, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bridge Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on BIA land ten miles north of Keller, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Winding Waters Complex (2 fires), Wallowa Unit, ODF. IMT 1 (ODF Team 2). Twenty-three miles east of Union, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cougar Creek, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 12). Twenty-three miles southwest of Asotin, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Battle Mountain Complex (2 fires), Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 1 (ODF Team 3) and IMT 1 (ODF Team 1). IMT is also managing the Courtrock fire. Eight miles north of Ukiah, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Courtrock, Fossil Unit, ODF. Seven miles south of Monument, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with spotting, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Microwave Tower, The Dalles Unit, Oregon DOF. Five miles southwest of Mosier, OR. Grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Whisky Creek, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 2). Six miles southeast of Cascade Locks, OR. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, flanking and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red, Deschutes NF, USFS. CIMT (EA Team 1). IMT is also managing the Wickiup fire. Eighteen miles west of Crescent, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wickiup, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eight miles west of La Pine, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Badland Complex, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (RM Team 2). Three miles northeast of Durkee, OR. Brush and timber. Active fire behavior with running, isolated torching and smoldering. Structures, energy, communication infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lone Rock, Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 2). Started on county land 10 miles southeast of Condon, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Durkee, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SA Team 3). Started on private land one mile west of Durkee, OR. Grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and smoldering. Numerous structures, energy and communication infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

* **Pincer Two**, Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie NF, USFS. Fourteen miles east of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cliff Mountain, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Joseph, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group and single tree torching. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area closure in effect.

Camp Creek, Prineville District, BLM. Ten miles southwest of Paulina, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and single tree torching. Structures, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wolf Creek, Payette NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 7). IMT is also managing the Boulder and Bulltrout fires. Eleven miles northwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Boulder, Boise NF, USFS. Nine miles southwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and flanking. Communication infrastructure and structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated to scattered mainly wet thunderstorms will shift north from northern California through the Cascades and Inland Northwest, Great Basin, and West Slope, but several dry strikes are likely outside rain cores. Well above normal temperatures will continue, but the heat and thunderstorm development will be offset by abundant cloud cover in some areas. Relative humidity will be higher, generally above 15% except across western and central Wyoming where single digits are expected. Isolated to scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are likely to continue overnight through Idaho and western Montana. Somewhat drier air will shift into southern California, keeping thunderstorms isolated if any develop at all. Scattered wet thunderstorms are likely in the Southwest into the southern Great Basin and southern Colorado. Overall winds are expected to be light except near thunderstorms where outflows could reach 50 mph.

A backdoor front will bring modest relief from heat to the central and southern Plains, with isolated to scattered thunderstorms from the central/southern High Plains to central Texas. Wet weather will be likely along much of the Gulf and East Coasts, while a tropical disturbance off the west coast of Florida will bring increasing showers and thunderstorms to the southern half of the peninsula. Drier conditions are forecast across Alaska today, while a few more showers are expected on the windward sides of Hawai'i as trade winds increase.
