* **Trail**, Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Sixteen miles southwest of Chemult, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching, short crown runs and spotting. Area and trail closures in effect.

Ore, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Seven miles northeast of Blue River, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, backing and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Falls, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Twenty-six miles northwest of Burns, OR. Timber and grass. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Lone Rock, Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 2). Started on county land 10 miles southeast of Condon, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, backing and group torching. Community of Hardman and numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Pioneer, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 12) and CIMT (NW Team 3). Started on private land 10 miles southeast of Stehekin, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cougar Creek, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). Twenty-three miles southwest of Asotin, WA. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Cow Valley, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 6). IMT is also managing the Durkee and Bonita Road incidents. Started on private land nine miles east of Ironside, OR. Brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Durkee, Vale District, BLM. One mile west of Durkee, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Active fire behavior with running, backing and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Bonita Road, Vale District, BLM. Started on private land nine miles southeast of Ironside, OR. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Larch Creek, The Dalles Unit, Oregon DOF. Transfer of command from IMT 1 (ODF Team 2) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Fifteen miles south of The Dalles, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Salt Creek, Medford District, BLM. Five miles southwest of Butte Falls, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

* **Easy**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seventeen miles west of Mazama, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching, short crown runs and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Battle Mountain Complex (2 Fires)**, Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 1 (ODF Team 3) mobilizing. Includes the previously reported NF Owens and Snake incidents. Eight miles north of Ukiah, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with running, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

* **Boneyard**, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Ten miles north of Monument, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with running, spotting and torching. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Wickiup**, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eight miles west of La Pine, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with isolated torching and short crown runs. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

* **Monkey Creek**, Prineville District, BLM. Thirteen miles southwest of Ukiah, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and torching.

* **Jack Canyon**, Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. Started in private land five miles northeast of Pilot Rock, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

* **Swawilla I**, Colville Agency, BIA. Ten miles southwest of Keller, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

Shoofly, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Sixteen miles northeast of Skykomish, WA. Timber and brush. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.

Grass, chaparral and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Trout, Sequoia NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 14). CIMT is also managing the Long and Packsaddle incidents. Eighteen miles north of Kernville, CA. Timber, brush and grass. Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot temperatures with low afternoon relative humidity below 20% will continue across the Inland Northwest, northern Rockies, California, and western Great Basin. Slightly cooler, but still above normal, temperatures are forecast for central and eastern Montana. Poor overnight recovery will continue as well, with areas below 40%, especially for mid-slopes and ridges in the northern Intermountain West. Isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are likely on the western periphery of monsoon moisture for portions of the central and northeast Great Basin into southern Montana, while drier conditions will develop in the Mojave Desert into south-central Arizona.

Deeper monsoon moisture will bring scattered wet thunderstorms to the Mogollon Rim and eastern Arizona into New Mexico and the central Rockies, with scattered to widespread thunderstorms extending into the central Plains. Scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms will develop along a stalled front from southeast Texas to the Carolina coast. Cool, but dry conditions will spread across much of the Eastern Area into Kentucky and Virginia, but winds are forecast to be light.
