Lone Rock, Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 2). Started on county land 10 miles southeast of Condon, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and group torching. Community of Hardman and numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Battle Mountain Complex (2 fires), Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 1 (ODF Team 3). Eight miles north of Ukiah, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, road and area closures in effect.

Falls, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Twenty-six miles northwest of Burns, OR. Timber and grass. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, running and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Durkee, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 6). IMT is also managing the Cow Valley incident. One mile west of Durkee, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Cow Valley, Vale District, BLM. Started on private land nine miles east of Ironside, OR. Brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Cougar Creek, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 13). Twenty-three miles southwest of Asotin, WA. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Pioneer, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 3). IMT is also managing the Easy incident. Started on private land 10 miles southeast of Stehekin, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Easy, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seventeen miles west of Mazama, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Diamond Complex (3 fires)**, Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Includes the previously reported Trail incident. Eighteen miles southwest of Chemult, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, group torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ore, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Seven miles northeast of Blue River, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, torching and group torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Pyramid**, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 5) mobilizing. Seventeen miles northeast of Cascadia, OR. Timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing.

Boneyard, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. IMT 1 (ODF Team 1). Ten miles north of Monument, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowing, running and spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eighteen miles west of Crescent, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Structures threatened.

Swawilla I, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 6) mobilizing. Ten miles southwest of Keller, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with torching, group torching spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Bridge Creek**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Ten miles north of Keller, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Wickiup, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eight miles west of La Pine, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking and flanking and backing. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Larch Creek, The Dalles Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles south of The Dalles, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Salt Creek, Medford District, BLM. Five miles southwest of Butte Falls, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing and smoldering. Road closures in effect.

Road R, Spokane District, BLM. Started on private land one mile north of Wilson Creek, WA. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened.

* **Cat Rock**, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. Seven miles north of Prineville, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running and torching. Structures threatened.

Monkey Creek, Prineville District, BLM. Thirteen miles of Ukiah, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

* **Lane 1**, East Lane Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles southeast of Springfield, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Area and road closures in effect.

* **Clark 900**, Northwest District, BLM. Nineteen miles southwest of Oakridge, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and short-range spotting.

* **Chalk**, Willamette NF, USFS. Nine miles northeast of Oakridge, OR. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated dry thunderstorms may be ongoing from the Cascade crest westward in Oregon as the upper-level wave moves northward, with isolated dry thunderstorms likely to continue during the day as they move into central and western Washington. Scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are likely to develop across south-central into eastern Oregon during the afternoon as well and possibly into far northeast California, southwest Idaho, and northwest Nevada. Hot, record-setting temperatures with low afternoon relative humidity below 20% and poor overnight recovery are expected across the Inland Northwest, northern and western Great Basin, northern Rockies, and into California. Breezy westerly winds are likely in the Cascade Gaps of Oregon into northeast California as well.

Deeper monsoon moisture will bring scattered wet thunderstorms to much of the Southwest and central Rockies, with more isolated wet thunderstorms into central Nevada and Wyoming. Scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms will develop along a stalled front from the central Texas to the Southeast coast, with scattered showers and thunderstorms extending into the western Mississippi Valley. Cool and dry conditions will continue across much of the Great Lakes and Northeast with light winds, although a weak cold front could bring isolated showers and thunderstorms to the Great Lakes.
