Predictive Services Discussion:

Temperatures in the Mississippi Valley and eastward will be cooler than normal today, while high temperatures across much of the West will be normal to above normal, with the hottest areas reaching 105°F in parts of far southern California and southwest Arizona. In general, most the of the West will experience warm, dry conditions with the potential for isolated dry thunderstorms in portions of northern New Mexico where breezy, westerly winds are also likely. Scattered wet thunderstorm activity will develop over eastern New Mexico, Colorado and into west Texas and much of the Great Plains, with isolated severe thunderstorms possible in parts of the central and northern High Plains. The southern half of Florida is likely to receive showers and thunderstorms with some areas receiving periods of heavy rain. A cooling trend is forecast for Alaska with cooler temperatures, into the mid 70s in the interior, and higher relative humidity than in recent days. Wetting rain is forecast for the southern parts of the state.
