Hurricane Helene Support – NC, North Carolina Forest Service. CIMT (NC State). Primary mission is to coordinate emergency road clearing efforts, perform damage assessments and deliver commodities throughout western North Carolina.

Hudson, Texas A&M Forest Service. Started on private land 5 miles east of Bastrop, TX. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Red – Goblin, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Twelve miles southeast of Manchester, KY. Hardwood litter and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, backing and uphill runs.

Rush, Wichita Mountains National Wildlife Refuge, FWS. Fifteen miles northwest of Lawton, OK. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Summit Lake, Ottawa NF, USFS. Thirteen miles north of Michigamme, MI. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Middleton Pond, Massachusetts Bureau of Forest Fire Control. Started on private land 1 mile west of Middleton, MA. Hardwood litter, grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Residences threatened.

Cain Hill, Massachusetts Bureau of Forest Fire Control. Two miles west of Salem, MA. Hardwood litter and brush. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A strong cold front will move south through the Intermountain West as a deep trough drops south along the west slope of the Rockies. Scattered showers will develop near and behind the front across the eastern Great Basin and northern and central Rockies, with snow levels falling to 3,000 to 5,000 feet. The front will be dry as it moves through northern California and the Sierra, with breezy north to northeasterly offshore winds developing in the afternoon and overnight. Winds are likely to be strongest overnight with gusts to 60 mph in favored canyons of the Sierra and in the Bay Area. Poor overnight relative humidity recovery with the winds will result in elevated fire weather conditions. Much of the Plains will be drier today while widespread wetting rain falls along a cold front from the Lower Mississippi Valley into the Lower Ohio Valley and Great Lakes. Scattered thunderstorms are likely in the Lower Mississippi Valley, as well. Well above normal temperatures are forecast in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast with breezy southerly winds gusting to 30 mph, although minimum relative humidity will remain somewhat elevated and above 35%.
