Predictive Services Discussion:

A cold front will move through the central Rockies and Southwest and onto much of the Plains today. Precipitation will be light with the system during the day with scattered showers in the central Rockies, falling as snow above 6,000 feet. Breezy southerly winds will develop on the Plains during the day, before scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms develop overnight from Oklahoma to the Dakotas. Another cold front will move into the Northwest, with moderate to heavy precipitation west of the Cascades. Breezy and dry north to northwesterly winds will develop across much of the Northeast into the Mid-Atlantic, and while temperatures will be cooler, areas of elevated conditions are possible. Dry conditions will continue in much of the Southeast, although scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop along the northern Gulf Coast.
