Predictive Services Discussion:

A dry cold front will move through the Northwest, northern Rockies, and northern Plains today. Breezy and dry westerly winds of 15-25 mph with gusts 30-45 mph amid relative humidity of 5-20% will develop across eastern Oregon into the northern Great Basin, northern/central Rockies, and the northern Plains. Dry southwesterly winds of 15-20 mph amid relative humidity of 20-35% will create elevated conditions from the Texas panhandle northeast into the Upper Great Lakes, as well. Well above normal temperatures up to 105°F will continue across much of California into the southern Great Basin and Southwest, with afternoon relative humidity remaining below 15% and very poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges. A weakening cold front will bring isolated showers to the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, while dry conditions are expected in the Southeast.
