**Pack Trail**, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 10). Twenty-five miles southeast of Moran, WY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

**Yellow Lake**, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. Ten miles southeast of Francis, UT. Timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with group torching, flanking and backing. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

**Wapiti**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4). CIMT (GB Team 3) mobilizing. IMT is also managing the Frog fire. Fourteen miles west of Stanley, ID. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Frog**, Sawtooth NF, USFS. Nineteen miles southeast of Stanley, ID. Grass, brush and timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lava**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 2). Twelve miles southwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Red Rock**, Salmon-Challis NF, USFS. Fifteen miles west of Salmon, ID. Timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with backing, single tree torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Black Eagle**, Salmon-Challis NF, USFS. Previously reported incident. Thirty-one miles west of Salmon, ID. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, single tree torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

**Goat**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 6). IMT is also managing the Snag fire and the Middle Fork Complex. Eleven miles southeast of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Snag**, Boise NF, USFS. Ten miles east of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Middle Fork Complex (2 fires)**, Boise NF, USFS. Nine miles east of Garden Valley, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Rosie**, Southwest Supervisory Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. Twenty-five miles southeast of Jordan Valley, OR. Medium slash and grass. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and wind-driven runs. Structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

**Willamette Complex (4 fires)**, Willamette NF, USFS. Eight miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and flanking. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Goosmus**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land five miles north of Curlew, WA. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A strong, dry cold front will move through the Northwest during the day and into the northern Rockies, northern Great Basin, and northern California overnight. Strong west to southwesterly winds of 20-40 mph with gusts 35-60 mph will develop amid relative humidity of 8-25% from southeast Oregon and northeast California through the northern/central Great Basin into southern Montana and western Wyoming. The strongest winds are expected across the northern Great Basin. Overnight, strong downslope westerly winds will develop with the passage of the cold front near and east of the Divide in Montana and Wyoming into the western Dakotas with gusts up to 70 mph possible. Poor overnight humidity recovery of 20-40% is expected in the northern Great Basin into the western Dakotas, as well. Widespread elevated to critical conditions are expected with the winds.

Farther south, hot temperatures up to 110°F will continue across the lower elevations of California into the Southwest and southern Great Basin with minimum humidity of 5-15% and poor overnight recovery below 30% for mid-slopes and ridges. Mild and very dry conditions will continue in the Upper Great Lakes with minimum relative humidity as low as 20%, but winds will be light overall. Farther south and east, isolated showers are expected in the Appalachians to the Northeast with scattered thunderstorms along the Gulf Coast. Most of the rain in the West will be west of the Cascades in northwest Oregon and western Washington, although scattered showers will occur in the Idaho Panhandle overnight.
