Predictive Services Discussion:

A dry cold front will progress through the northern and central Plains and Great Basin, with strong downslope westerly winds continuing east of the Divide in Montana and Wyoming through the Dakotas. Gusty westerly winds are also forecast across portions of northeast Utah. Strong winds of 20-40 mph with gusts to 60 mph both ahead of and behind the front will create widespread elevated to critical conditions despite relative humidity remaining near or above 15%. While winds will be lighter across the Colorado Front Range, relative humidity will drop into the single digits amid well above normal temperatures. As the front moves through the central Great Lakes overnight, isolated to scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are possible, as well. Cooler temperatures closer to normal will spread across the northern Intermountain West, but relative humidity will still be rather low at 10-25% across much of the Inland Northwest, northern California, and northern Great Basin. Hot, well above normal, record-setting temperatures to 110°F will continue across inland southern California into the Southwest. Much of the eastern US will be dry as well with near to above normal temperatures, although scattered thunderstorms remain likely along the immediate Gulf Coast.
