Yellow Lake, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). Ten miles southeast of Francis, UT. Timber, medium slash and grass. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching, and short-range spotting. Several communities, numerous structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Pack Trail, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 10). Twenty-five miles southeast of Moran, WY. Timber, medium slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, spotting and backing. Several communities and numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red Rock, Salmon-Challis NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 3). Fifteen miles west of Salmon, ID. Grass, hardwood litter and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and torching. Sage-grouse habitat threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Logan, Payette NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 3). One mile west of Edwardsburg, ID. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, isolated torching and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Castle Ridge, Elko District, BLM. Three miles north of Midas, NV. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Valley, Southwest Supervisory Area Office, Idaho Department of Lands. One mile east of Boise, ID. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Middle Fork Complex (2 fires), Boise NF, USFS. Nine miles east of Garden Valley, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lava, Boise NF, USFS. Twelve miles southwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing, smoldering and creeping. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A strong cold front will move through the Ohio Valley and Appalachians into the Southeast and southern Plains. Ahead of the front, south to southwest sustained winds of 12-20 mph with gusts of 20-30 mph amid relative humidity of 10-30% will create areas of elevated conditions across central Texas into the Lower Mississippi Valley. Dry conditions will continue in the Southeast with minimum relative humidity of 25-35%, while breezy and dry north to northwest winds of 15-25 mph and gusts 25-40 mph develop on the northern and central Plains to the Mid-Mississippi Valley. The cold front will bring showers and thunderstorms to the Great Lakes and Northeast, most numerous downwind of the Great Lakes. Temperatures will remain above normal across the Intermountain West, with areas of poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges, especially for the Great Basin into the Southwest. Locally gusty southwest winds are possible in northern Arizona and West Slope, and isolated high-based showers and thunderstorms are likely in the greater Four Corners region.
