Predictive Services Discussion:

Low-pressure will remain over the Four Corners, with scattered showers over the Greater Four Corners as snow levels remain 7,000 to 9,000 feet. Widespread showers and scattered thunderstorms will develop farther east on the central and southern High Plains, with areas of heavy rain and localized flooding possible. Breezy north to northeasterly offshore winds are likely to continue in much of California through the morning, with the winds weakening in the afternoon and overnight. However, relative humidity will remain very low in the single digits and teens, with fair to poor overnight recovery. Rain will continue in western Washington as a storm moves into western Canada, with breezy and dry downslope westerly winds forecast across north-central Montana into western North Dakota.

Breezy southwesterly winds of 12-20 mph will continue on the central Plains and Mid/Upper Mississippi Valley, but relative humidity is expected to increase to near to above 25%. Very dry air but light winds will persist across the Lower Mississippi Valley into the Ohio Valley, Appalachians, and Southeast.
