Predictive Services Discussion:

Low-pressure in the Four Corners will begin to move into the central High Plains, with breezy southerly winds continuing on the High Plains accompanied by widespread showers and isolated thunderstorms. Scattered showers with high elevation snow will continue in the Greater Four Corners, as well. Warm and very dry conditions are expected in California with minimum relative humidity in the single digits and teens and poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges. Breezy westerly winds will develop ahead of a cold front in the Columbia Basin, with widespread showers in the Cascades westward to the coast during the day that will spread into eastern Washington and north Idaho overnight. Breezy southwesterly winds of 12-20 mph will continue in the Upper Mississippi Valley, but relative humidity will remain above 30%. Dry air will persist from the Mid/Lower Mississippi Valley into the Ohio Valley, Appalachians, and Southeast, with relative humidity as low as 20% in the afternoon. Overall winds will be light, but southerly winds of 10-18 mph are possible in the Mid-Mississippi Valley in the afternoon.
