Predictive Services Discussion:

A mostly dry cold front will work its way through the Great Lakes today with light and scattered rain showers extending from the Lakes to the Ohio Valley. High pressure with warm temperatures and light winds will be in place across both the Northeast and the Southeast, with widespread minimum humidity of 15-30%. There will be some breezy southwest winds ahead of the front over the eastern Ohio Valley, otherwise winds over the East will be light. Expansive high pressure will bring dry weather to the entire western two thirds of the country. Temperatures will be above normal for most of the West, particularly for California, the Great Basin, and the Southwest where humidity will also be in the single digits and teens in most cases. There will also be poor overnight recoveries below 25% in many of those areas. There will be some breezy south to southwest winds over Northern California and southwest Oregon today along with those low RHs, with sustained winds increasing to 15 to 20 mph. Otherwise, winds will be broadly light across much of the West. Cooler temperatures and somewhat higher humidity will be found east of the Cascades in Washington and into the Northern Rockies.
