Predictive Services Discussion:

A Pacific cold front will move into the Northwest, northern Rockies, and northern California tomorrow with moderate to heavy precipitation, and snow above 4,000 to 6,000 feet. Dry and breezy westerly winds will develop ahead of the front across the Great Basin into the central and southern Rockies. A rapidly weakening cold front will move through the Great Lakes, Ohio Valley, Lower Mississippi Valley, and East Texas with light to moderate rainfall. Dry conditions will continue in the Southeast ahead of the front but minimum relative humidity is forecast to remain above 35%. Cooler and less windy conditions are expected on much of the Plains behind the front.
