Predictive Services Discussion:

Upper-level high pressure will gradually build along the West Coast maintaining a seasonably warm and dry weather regime for much of the West. A weak disturbance crossing British Columbia will bring clouds and isolated rain showers to portions of western Washington and northwest Oregon. Temperatures will trend slightly above average for southwest Oregon into central and northern California while temperatures remain near average elsewhere in the West. Locally breezy north winds will develop in the Sacramento Valley, mainly late morning into the afternoon hours, resulting in gradually lowering RH and only moderate recovery Sunday night. Drier and cooler-than-average conditions across much of the Southwest although temperatures rebound back to near normal in Arizona.

A cold front extending from the Great Lakes to the Mid-Mississippi Valley, and Southern Plains will bring widespread showers and thunderstorms to much of the central U.S. The heaviest rain is likely for the Mid-Mississippi Valley, especially Missouri and southern Illinois; however, widespread wetting rain is forecast for north central and northwest Texas, central and southwest Oklahoma, and the Great Lakes. In contrast, ahead of the front, minimum RH as low as 25% will develop across portions of southern Ohio into West Virginia, although showers will move into the Upper Ohio Valley Sunday night. Dry conditions will continue in the Southeast, but minimum RH will remain above 40% most areas. Across the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast, mainly dry and very warm conditions with light to moderate winds and RH above critical thresholds before areas of rainfall spread eastward Sunday night.
