Willamette Complex (4 fires), Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6) and CIMT (EA Team 1). IMTs are also managing the Red and Ore fires. Eight miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eighteen miles west of Crescent, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ore, Willamette NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Blue River, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wiley Flat, Ochoco NF, USFS. CIMT (AK Team 3). IMT is also managing the Rail Ridge fire. Thirty-one miles southeast of Prineville, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rail Ridge, Prineville, District, BLM. Fifty-one miles northwest of Burns, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Homestead Complex (4 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT (NW Team 12) mobilizing. Thirty miles northeast of Glide, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Buck Creek, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty miles southwest of Silver Lake, OR. Timber and medium slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Area and road closures in effect.

Diamond Complex (2 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 14). Eighteen miles southwest of Chemult, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Fossil Complex (3 fires), Fossil Unit. IMT 1 (ODF Team 3). Two miles northwest of Spray, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Firestone, Deschutes NF, USFS. Twenty-one miles north of Fort Rock, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Devils Knob, Umpqua NF, USFS. Five miles southeast of Tiller, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Swauk Creek, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. Two miles south of Liberty, WA. Brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area and trail closures in effect.

Whisky Creek, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Six miles southeast of Cascade Locks, OR. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and flanking. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Williams Mine, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Four miles northwest of Trout Lake, WA. Brush, timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A strong dome of high pressure aloft shifts eastward and centers over the Great Basin late in the day maintaining a dry and unseasonably warm weather regime for the West. Limited moisture combined with daytime heating may support isolated showers and thunderstorms over New Mexico, while onshore flow produces patchy light rain across western Washington. Gusty north winds in the Sacramento Valley and light to moderate offshore winds from northwest California to southwest Oregon will diminish during the morning. A slow-moving low-pressure system over the middle of the country and associated cold front will bring widespread showers and thunderstorms to the eastern Great Lakes, Upper Ohio and Tennessee Valleys, and much of the southern and central Appalachian and Mid-Atlantic regions. The Southeast will remain mostly dry with isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms favoring the northern parts of Alabama and Georgia westward to central Texas, with isolated thunderstorms in south Florida as well.
