Rail Ridge, Prineville, District, BLM. CIMT (AK Team 3). CIMT (NW Team 8) mobilizing. IMT is also managing the Wiley Flat fire. Fifty-one miles northwest of Burns, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and spotting. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wiley Flat, Ochoco NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (AK Team 3) back to the local unit will occur today. Thirty-one miles southeast of Prineville, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Willamette Complex (4 fires), Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (EA Team 1). Eight miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eighteen miles west of Crescent, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Homestead Complex (4 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). IMT is also managing the Diamond Complex. Thirty miles northeast of Glide, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Diamond Complex (2 fires), Umpqua NF, USFS. Eighteen miles southwest of Chemult, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Goosmus, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land five miles north of Curlew, WA. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with isolated torching, flanking and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bachelor Complex, Deschutes NF, USFS. Twenty miles southwest of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Pack Trail, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 10) is mobilizing. Twenty-five miles southeast of Moran, WY. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, crowning, and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

* **Yellow Lake**, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. Ten miles southeast of Francis, UT. Timber and medium slash. Extreme fire behavior with running, spotting and group torching. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Lava, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 2). Twelve miles southwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Wapiti, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4). IMT is also managing the Frog fire. Fourteen miles west of Stanley, ID. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Frog, Sawtooth NF, USFS. Nineteen miles southeast of Stanley, ID. Grass, brush and timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Red Rock, Salmon-Challis NF, USFS. Fifteen miles west of Salmon, ID. Timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with backing, single tree torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A robust cold front pushing southeastward across the northern Plains will reach the western Great Lakes and southern Plains late in the day while gradually backing to the southwest along the Front Range. Cooler, more seasonable temperatures settle into the Northern Rockies, northern Great Basin and Inland Northwest with near to slightly below average highs in the 50s and 60s across northern Wyoming and Montana

Locally critical conditions are likely in northeast Utah, western/southern Wyoming, western Minnesota, South Dakota and Nebraska amid RH of 10-20% and lingering gusty winds to around 40 mph. Along the West Coast, strong/gusty offshore winds with hot temperatures and very low RH <20% will create locally critical conditions for interior northern California.

Away from the mountainous regions of the Southwest and Colorado Rockies where isolated showers and thunderstorms develop this afternoon, a dry pattern dominates the West. Hot temperatures of 95-110°F will be widespread for interior California, southern Great Basin and lower elevations of Arizona amid RH of 5-15% and generally light winds. The western Great Lakes will have a chance of showers and thunderstorms accompanying the cold front while showery weather persists for the Upper Ohio Valley, central Appalachians and Mid-Atlantic. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be found across Florida. Dry and seasonable weather with temperatures in the 60s and 70s continue across the Northeast.
