**Table Rock Complex** (3 fires), South Carolina Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 2). Four miles northeast of Sunset, SC. Timber, hardwood litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Big Ridge**, Chattahoochee-Oconee NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). Eight miles northeast of Clayton, GA. Harwood litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Rattlesnake Branch**, North Carolina Forest Service. CIMT (SA Team 1). Eleven miles southeast of Waynesville, NC. Hardwood litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Black Cove**, North Carolina Forest Service. Transfer of command from CIMT (NC State Team 1) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. IMT is also managing the Deep Woods fire. Five miles northeast of Saluda, NC. Hardwood litter, light slash and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Deep Woods**, North Carolina Forest Service. Four miles northeast of Saluda, NC. Hardwood litter, timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Alarka #5**, North Carolina Forest Service. Five miles south of Bryson City, NC. Hardwood litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

**East Marsh**, Lake Woodruff NWR, FWS. One mile west of Deland, FL. Grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and single tree torching.

#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Dry and breezy southwesterly sustained winds of 12-20 mph with gusts to 35 mph amid relative humidity of 10-20% will create areas of elevated conditions across southern and eastern New Mexico into far West Texas. A cold front will stall from northeast Texas into the central Appalachians and Northwest, with widespread showers and thunderstorms, especially from northeast Texas into the Ohio Valley where heavy rain and areas of flooding are expected. A deep upper-level trough will remain over the Intermountain West, with scattered showers in the Rockies, mainly falling as snow. Some mixed precipitation will fall into the adjacent northern and central High Plains, as well. Drier conditions will continue across the Southeast with southern winds around 10 mph, but minimum relative humidity will remain above 40%. Light snow is expected to end across the Interior of Alaska, with scattered showers continuing in far western Alaska, while land and see breezes are expected across Hawai'i with widespread showers across Kauai as a cold front approaches.
