Predictive Services Discussion:

Northeasterly Santa Ana winds will continue today across southern California, with peak gusts to 55 mph as relative humidity falls to near 10% and poor overnight recovery. Lake-effect snow is forecast in the Great Lakes under northwesterly winds today, with locally heavy amounts downwind of the lakes. A dissipating cold front will also bring areas of light snow to portions of Montana and Wyoming, east of the Divide, with areas of light snow into portions of the central Plains. A weak storm will move though the northeastern Gulf of Mexico, bringing areas of wetting rain to southern Georgia and much of Florida. Much of the rest of the US will remain dry today dur to upper-level ridging along near the West Coast, with a dry northwesterly flow aloft across the rest of the country. Drier conditions are expected across much of Alaska, as well, except for heavy rain continuing across the panhandle and light snow across the western Interior and western Brooks Range.
