This report will be posted Monday - Friday at 0730 Mountain Time unless significant activity occurs.

Eight MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Port Hueneme, CA to support wildland fire operations in southern California. Their respective units are as follows: 153rd Airlift Wing (WY Air National Guard), 302nd Airlift Wing (CO Air Force Reserve), 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard), and 152nd Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard).

Two crews and two overhead personnel from Alberta, Canada, and one crew and one overhead personnel from British Columbia, Canada have been deployed to southern California to assist with wildland fire operations.

Two CL-415 aircraft from Quebec, Canada have been deployed to southern California to assist with wildland fire operations.

Cumulative acres showing in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Much of the West will be dry and cooler than normal, but moderate to locally strong northeasterly Santa Ana winds of 20-40 mph gusting to 60 mph will develop across southern California by mid-afternoon with locally stronger gusts. Relative humidity will fall to 5-15% with very poor overnight recovery. Breezy and dry northerly winds gusting to 45 mph are also expected across the Lower Colorado River Valley into much of Arizona. Very cold temperatures will continue across much of the Plains to East Coast, with below zero readings in the Midwest and below freezing temperatures to the Gulf Coast. A weak storm will develop in the western Gulf of Mexico during the day, with light to moderate precipitation spreading across much of South and East Texas into the Lower Mississippi Valley. An ice storm is likely near and along the Texas and Louisiana Gulf Coast, while snow falls away from the coast into much of the Lower Mississippi Valley. A strong storm will bring rain to the southwest coast of Alaska, with heavy snow for southwest Alaska into the western Interior. Dry conditions will continue across Hawai'i under moderate to breezy trade winds.
