Their respective units are as follows: 153rd Airlift Wing (WY Air National Guard), 302nd Airlift Wing (CO Air Force Reserve), 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard), and 152nd Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard).

Two crews and two overhead personnel from Alberta, Canada, and one crew and one overhead personnel from British Columbia, Canada have been deployed to southern California to assist with wildland fire operations.

Two CL-415 aircraft from Quebec, Canada have been deployed to southern California to assist with wildland fire operations.

#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Widespread showers will spread across southern California today, with snow levels as low as 3,000 feet and several inches of snow in the mountains. Breezy and dry southwesterly winds are expected in Arizona, but relative humidity will be higher today with a chance of showers overnight in western Arizona. Breezy and dry westerly winds will spread across the northern Plains bringing above normal temperatures, while lighter winds are forecast in the southern Plains. Scattered snow showers will move through the Great Lakes and Northeast, while showers and thunderstorms develop across East Texas and the Lower Mississippi Valley. A strong storm will continue to move through Alaska, with strong winds and heavy rain along the south coast, while Arctic cold front brings heavy snow to southwest Alaska and the central/western Interior. Breezy trade winds will continue across Hawai'i, with scattered to widespread windward showers.
