**Covington Drive**, South Carolina Forestry Commission. CIMT (FL State Team 1). Two miles west of Myrtle Beach, SC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Numerous residences threatened.

\* **Maker**, Osage Agency, BIA. One mile north of Blackburn, OK. Hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing.

\* **Kenwood 15**, Tahlequah Field Office, BIA. Three miles northeast of Kenwood, OK. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Residences threatened.

\* **Cottam**, Lower Rio Grande Valley NWR, FWS. One mile north of Los Longoria, TX. Grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing and flanking. Residences threatened.

**East Parkway**, Tennessee DOF. Two miles southeast of Laurel, TN. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

**Falls Dam**, National Forests in North Carolina, USFS. Two miles east of Badin, NC. Timber and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior. Residences threatened.

**Devils Jumps**, Big South Fork National River & Recreation Area, NPS. Nine miles northwest of Winfield, TN. Hardwood litter and brush. No new information.

**Kenwood 9**, Tahlequah Field Office, BIA. One mile east of Kenwood, OK. Closed timber litter and hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering. No new information.

**Two Barrel**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Twelve miles northeast of Wewahitchk, FL. Southern rough, timber and grass. No new information.

**Predictive Services Discussion:**

West winds of 20-30 mph and gusts to 45 mph amid relative humidity of 5-15% will develop across southeastern Arizona into southern New Mexico creating elevated to critical conditions. Low relative humidity of 15-30% will be common east of the Mississippi River, and breezy westerly winds in the Ohio Valley will create localized elevated conditions. Showers will fall in southern California as an upper-level low moves onshore, with showers spreading into Arizona overnight. A Pacific storm will move into the Northwest tonight, with widespread precipitation, falling as snow above 5,000 to 6,000 feet.
